Tony writes:

Dear friends,

Many people think of the worship of the Church as something, which happens on separate, unconnected Sundays. On this assumption it is fine to pick and choose which Sunday to come to Church. However, from November until June,



the worship of the Church is something of a journey, a journey, which is, in fact, in two stages. It is sad that there are many people who pay flying visits to the mid-points of the stages at Christmas and Easter and ignore all that leads up to and flows from them. Journeying, being pilgrims together is part of God's will for his people and is also part of a cyclical ancient rhythm, which followed the seasons.

In pre-Christian times much was made of the moments of transition, pivotal moments half-way between the solstices and the equinoxes. They were the year's turning points and while Christmas was a Christianisation of the winter solstice or Yule, All Saints (Samhain), Candlemas (Imbolc), May Day (Beltane) and Lammas (Lughnasa) continued the tradition of the "turning points", the first two decidedly Christian and the latter two relics of something much more ancient, as is, of course, the Eve of All Saints', known to us as Halloween!

The first stage in the journey actually ends this month and began 3 months ago at the turning-point of All Saints' Day on 1st November, when we remind ourselves who we are, namely the journeying people of God on earth and in heaven. We then turn our faces towards Christmas, a process which gathers pace in Advent, when we prepare ourselves for the Coming of Christ to all of us. This is the recurring theme of the winter journey: God's gift of himself to us in Jesus for the healing and salvation of the world. We stand at the manger in Bethlehem and receive this gift afresh and then remind ourselves in the subsequent season of Epiphany that this is no private gift, but rather a gift for the whole world. The 3 month journey ends at Candlemas on the 2nd February, when we remember the presentation of the child Jesus in the Temple and turn our focus again to look towards Easter.

As we turn towards Easter, we very quickly (especially quickly this year!) begin the period of 40 days, which we call Lent. This is a time of preparation; a time to look afresh at our lives, resolving to put away things that are hindering our journey of faith and take on things which will have more positive effects. We do all of this, so that we will be ready to share in the great mysteries of our faith, as we journey with Our Lord in the days which lead up to his death on the cross. The joy of new life and new hope at Easter will be diminished, if we have not walked with Jesus through the dark days of Holy Week.

And so, we journey on into Easter. Easter is, however, not one day, but another journey of 40 days, this time walked in the company of the risen Christ, leading to his Ascension and culminating in the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Now Jesus hands the baton over to us. Jesus bids us continue the journey with his life and strength to enable us. "Go into all the world," he says, "And know that I am with you to the end of time." So begins afresh the real journey, the journey of our lives. The journey of our worship has been just a preparation, a springboard for living Christ's life in the world day by day, knowing that he is with us; that our journey is his journey and his journey ours, whatever roads we may travel now and in the days and years to come.




